AGENDA:

- 1) President welcomed members to country.

- 4) Minutes from last AGM as tabled were accepted by members
 - a. Correction to the name of Ms Elisa Barnard in previous AGM minutes was noted
- 5) Office bearers' reports were read and opened for discussion

Treasurer's report was tabled by Eric Tagudin

- Jon Barnard questioned the following:
 - o Reasons for deficits over 2 years, eating into savings in the bank.
 - New Westpac account savings as no merchant fees \$947. Jon questioned whether merchant fees from automatic payment system were now exceeded by fees from Sports TG system. Overall net effect should be made transparent to the members. Treasurer agreed to dissect this for future reports.
- Fran Boyle commented that the drop in active members during COVID lockdown had led to lower membership fees. Extension of AA membership due to closures had also delayed some membership payments to the following year. New members were now approaching the club since the reopening of SOPAC.
- Fran Boyle noted that when the club agreed to host the Australian Open, there was an expectation that there would be an option to host for two years in a row, so that the investment in infrastructure could be offset by fees from the second year.



Mitigating this financial loss was not possible due to COVID. Tangible benefits included
the additional targets for the club, as well as the less tangible benefit of exposure to
the Archery Community and continuing the Olympic Legacy, of interest to SOPAC.

Liz Hole confirmed she had audited the accounts, as per the Constitution.

Motion moved to accept the treasurer's report- All members voted in favour, no objection

Gloria Tse: Secretary Report including Membership

- 291 financial members
- 26 Associate members
- Breakdown of membership, 1/3 are female, 1/3 are veteran/master.
- Para membership stable. Event run with help of Ricci Cheah
- Jon asked for copy of report to be circulated.

Ricci Cheah: Coaching

There were a lot of changes in 2021 that were very challenging for coaches and athletes, exacerbated by COVID.

- Challenge to maintain coaching in the club in the year of Paralympics and Olympics
- Change in SOPA coaching structure to accommodate for national squad recurve program.
- Overseas coach (Oh Kyo Moon) working with national squad athletes from SOPA. 10 athletes from SOPA
- Assistant coaches Alex and Laura having more coaching involvement within the club programs. A team and B team plus continuing junior coaching.
- Coach Alex and Laura coaching the programs during lockdown.
- Coach Alex coaching the national youth squad whilst coach Oh was away in the Olympics
- Coach Alex coaching the para team whilst Ricci was at the Paralympics

Keeping the Flame Alive

- good results from juniors and seniors
- Opened the eyes of AA to the level of archery at SOPA

Australian Open

- Best performances by SOPA on home grounds
- Pete and Ameera winning the open division
- Multiple medals in team events

Olympic trials

• Melissa qualified for Olympic trials and made top 3 cut for Olympic team after a gruelling process.

Para nationals

- Took home all national titles 5 national titles
- 6 SOPA para archers qualified for paralympic trials



Czech Republic final quota qualification for Paralympics

- team of 5 (Peter Marchant, Garry Robinson, Imalia Oktrininda, Ameera Lee)
- Peter Marchant and Imalia Oktrininda won gold in the final qualifying event winning two quota spots
- Ameera narrowly missing out by few points for a quota spot.

Paralympics

- 3 of 4 Paralympians were from SOPA
- Top 17 finishes and a top 8 finish

Peter Bennett and Liz Hole: Tournament coordinators report and recorder report (Pamphlet circulated and copy attached)

- Back to Archery series, high levels of participation in this postal event.
- World Archery indoor series as a virtual event was also well subscribed.
- Club championships will be announced in January at the Dinner.
- QRE program was intense early in the year, fortnightly events.
- AO 38 SOPA archers, largest in 5 years, good feedback from participants. In future would need better financial structure.
- Oceania Tournament 39 SOPA members, 5 first places for SOPA members.
- Nationals: Penrith seniors, Warringah Juniors, many medal winners.

Noted that many learnings from 2021 would be implemented in 2022. Will have Keeping the Flame Alive, a matchplay series, and Unbreakable will be reactivated.

Prof. Fran Boyle: Safety

No lives of club members were lost during COVID, which was a great achievement. She thanked all members for assisting with ever changing safety measures. The booking system would be maintained for weekends, with a maximum of 2 members per target unless otherwise notified. Members were asked to be aware that some juniors were not yet vaccinated at this time, so it would be important to maintain distancing and hand hygiene, and to only handle their own arrows.

Members were reminded that when on the range, if they observed unfamiliar archers shooting in a dangerous manner, they could approach them, and ask to see their AA card. If any concerns remained after explanation of local rules (as per noticeboard), or membership could not be proven, the archer can be asked to leave. If any hostility is experienced, members are asked to care for their own safety first and call the Ranger, whose number is on the notice boards.

6) Election of Committee Members

2 nominations for president: Elizabeth Hole and Greg Nguyen nominated. Each gave a speech.



Greg Nguyen retracted his nomination, as he felt his inexperience had not led him to perform in this role as well as he would have liked. It had been a steep learning curve for him, but he had always tried to keep the club members interests at heart. He thanked the committee and members for their support.

Nominations received for Imalia Oktrininda and Peter Marchant (Para-Olympians 2021), and Ricci Cheah (Head Coach). Voting by secret ballot with Zoom attendees voting online. Results: Ricci Cheah voted in as life member. Imalia Oktrininda and Peter Marchant not approved.

- Vashe Chandrakanthan: Regional Development Squad were grateful for allocation of some lanes for their training. He asked that other members be aware of how many lanes are available during these times. Agreed by Liz Hole that this would be updated in booking system in Archers Diary.

TOURNAMENT OFFICER AND CLUB RECORDER REPORT FOR 2021

Peter Bennett our wonderful Tournament Officer and myself are delighted to let the membership know we have had a great year, even with COVID 19 always in the foreground.

First up were the BackToArchery & World Archery Indoor Series

So not time to dwell as it was full steam ahead and into 2 major remote tournaments.

Both were fantastic events and well supported by the membership with amazing results achieved in the Back to Archery - 18 GOLD, 8 SILVER and 7 BRONZE Medals.

The World Archery Indoor Series went virtual for the first time. Archers worldwide participated in the "Open category" online competition over one designated weekend every month from November 2020 to February 2021.

More than 5000 archers took part from around the world and competition was fierce. The event saw some amazing world rankings from our membership and we should be very proud of the clubs' achievements.



CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP AND QRES

We started working on the creation of the club championships which had never been done before. It was important to have championships that all ages, skill levels and division could take part in. It was a new era for the club and a time to celebrate all Members - no matter their age, bow type or ability.

The Distance and Short Course Championships are very completive which was great to witness. *Final results will be available and published on our website and on Facebook*

In January, our **QREs** started in earnest with a full calendar which was extremely well supported both by our members and archers from other clubs.

Then came Keeping the Flame Alive!

Fantastic lead into the Australian Open. It was well supported and a great event.

AUSTRALIAN OPEN 2021

The Australian Open 2021 (Event Booklet on our website) – It was an honour to be participant and be on the AO committee. It took months to organising and we had the best on our team.

We were delighted with the level of support from our 2021 Australian Open Partners and Sponsors. It was brilliant to not only host a fantastic event but to also have world class sponsors on board showing their support in us and the athletes. Their support of this tournament really made it stand out as one of the best archery tournaments in Australia, ever!

A big thank you to all our hardworking volunteers and officials. Events of this size and standard means a lot of heavy lifting behind the scenes to ensure a smooth and successful tournament for everyone.

We also have the most archers from any club take part in the tournament with 38 out of the 146 competitors – 19 Recurve, 12 Barebow, and 7 Compound and won 6 Gold, 5 Silver and 6 bronze an incredible haul!



CLASSIFICATION MEDALS

When I took up the position of Club Recorder, I really did not know what I was getting into and it was a little challenging at the start. First came the databases that took weeks to clean up but had to be done.

This allowed me to start checking whom had missed out on awards - Classification, all and perfect gold and State and National Medals and there was a huge number! It has been wonderful to present our archers with their medals of achievements and of course this is an ongoing exercise and an important one. To date we have presented 240 national Classification medals and 85 club all Gold/perfect medals and numerous State medals to our members.

OCEANIA CHALLENGE

This event came out of the blue. The shoot was a WA60/900 and a shorter distance for those that had been shooting for less than 12 months. Scores were submitted from Australia, Fiji, New Zealand, Niue, Norfolk Island, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Island, Tahiti, Tonga and Vanuatu.
